4 months: Pentacel (DTaP #2, IPV #2, HiB #2); PCV13 #2; Rota #2 (oral)

6 months: Pentacel (DTaP #3, IPV #3, HiB #3); PCV13 #3; Rota #3 (oral)

9 months: Hep B #3

12 months: MMR #1; Varicella #1; PCV13 #4

15 months: Pentacel (DTaP #4, IPV #4, HiB #4); Hep A #1

24 months: Hep A #2

4 years to 5 years: Quadracel (DTaP #5, IPV #5); ProQuad (MMR #2; Varicella #2)

11 years: Tdap; MCV4 #1; HPV #1

12 years: HPV #2

16 years: MCV4 #2
